468 Participants Attend Shea 2018 in Abuja, Nigeria



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On March 12th – 14th 2018, the GSA held its 11th Annual Conference in Abuja, Nigeria under the theme "Shea 2018, Going Further Together". 468 participants from 16 countries attended the two-day conference.

Panels Sessions

45 speakers presented on food standards, global market trends and industry growth. Panels included CODEX Standard for Unrefined Shea Butter, Regional Processing Opportunities and Challenges, and USAID Sustainable Shea Initiative.

On March 14th, 250 small and medium enterprises attended trainings including practical demonstrations on formulating cream for natural hair.

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USAID Sustainable Shea Initiative (SSI) Delivers Results For Women

During the quarter, through SSI, GSA members provided services on women's empowerment and ecosystem protection.

Women Empowerment

GSA members donated 10 warehouses to women shea collectors and processors. "The project is God-sent and should be replicated in all communities" says Gladys Ganyoni from Sori 2, Ghana.

Protection Of Ecosystem

2,086 women received shea parkland management and landscape restoration trainings. Trainings included management of natural regeneration, grafting, pruning, advocacy to stop tree cutting, and prevention of bush fires. "I wish to plant more trees on my husband's farm. Trees give me income and welfare for my family" says Mary Sampson from Tangbini, Ghana.

Snapshot: Members Share Best Practices

AAK And Burt's Bees Partner To Build Fuel-Efficient Cook-Stoves For Women

Global Shea Alliance members AAK and Burt's Bees recently teamed up to train 3,000 Burkinabe shea processors to build fuel-efficient cook stoves. The easyto-replicate model is entirely made from local materials. "The stoves are highly efficient and reduce wood and water consumption in processing stages. This benefits the women because they spend less time collecting wood, less time processing shea, and also less money on the inputs" says Kasper Torup-Villadsen, AAK West Africa Sourcing Director . Burt's Bees' Associate Director of Responsible Sourcing, Shannon Hess, recently visited the project and remarked, "The stoves improve the safety conditions of the women."



Empowering Women in Burkina Faso

VSLA Pre-Finance Women's Cooperative Activities

During the 2017 shea season, the Kanyir-Tietaah Songtaah women's cooperative from Taambare, Ghana, raised \$3,240 to pre-finance their shea trade from Village Savings and Loans Associations (VSLA). 18 VSLA groups within the cooperative contributed \$180, which the cooperative used to purchase 15MT of kernels from its members. Upon sales to a private buyer, at 31% above the pre-financed amount, the cooperative refunded the VSLAs, kept a tenth of the profit to establish a revolving loan fund and distributed the remaining 90% to members. Access to formal financial institutions in shea producing communities is impeded by high interest rates and lack of sufficient collateral. However, women's cooperatives are now utilizing community-based savings schemes such as VSLAs to establish sufficient credit for their shea business and other income generating activities.

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

On February 14th, GSA held a one-day forum to define a national sustainability strategy for Togo. 39 attendes from across the shea value chain in Togo discussed key constraints to project implementation including land ownership, and lack of public-private infrastructure. Stakeholders also developed a strategy to implement the GSA sustainability program, and identified different organizations and funding opportunities from donors in order to support their activities.

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GSA Holds Quality Working Group Meeting




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General Assembly Approves GSA 2017 Annual Report

FIKA-CI: 2017 Key Achievements And Perspectives



FIKA-CI (Filière Karité de Côte-d'Ivoire) is the national shea association of Ivory Coast.

At Shea 2018 in Abuja, Nigeria, FIKA-CI (the national shea association of Côte-d'Ivoire) presented the Ivorian national strategy for shea industry. They highlighted 2017 key results and 2018 plans.

Results

- 6 warehouses were constructed;
- 4,000 women collectors were trained on cooperative development, warehouse management, business development, and kernel aggregation;
- 620 women were trained in grafting, sowing techniques, and natural regeneration techniques;

14 SMEs and 9 women's group were trained on shea product formulation including candles, hair creams, soaps, and balms.

2018 Plans

In 2018, FIKA-CI will undertake the following activities inpartnership with UN Women and GSA:

- Construction of 10 warehouses;
- Capacity building for women collectors and processors;
- Distribution of gloves and boots;
- Launch of a shea shop.
